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## This Week at Tarago Public School

### Kindergarten Orientation

We look forward to welcoming our prospective kindergarten students for 2020. The first of 5 Kindergarten Orientation days will commence on Tuesday 29th October and run each Tuesday through to 26th November. Sessions run from 9.20am to 12.10pm. Children are able to be dropped off from **9.00am** or arrive on school bus. Children are to wear sensible clothing, runners or enclosed footwear. A brimmed hat is essential. Children must also bring a drink, fruit or veg for crunch 'n' sip and their lunch. Once the session has ended at 12.10pm children can be collected from Mrs Beer or staff members will walk them back to pre-school, if Tuesday is a regular Pre-school day. Please advise the office how your child will be leaving each session. If you have a child attending and you have not notified the school or returned enrolment information, please provide their details to the school office asap. We wish to be prepared for the new arrivals.

### Special Swim Scheme

#### **Dear Parents and Carers**

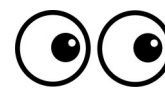
We have been busy reorganising the library and the students will now be attending Library and Digital Technology classes. Please ensure your child has a library bag so that the books can be protected.

Children are to bring their hats each day as the weather is warming up and are able to leave them in the classroom.

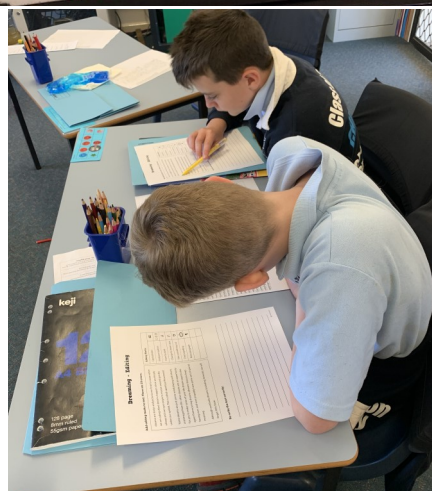
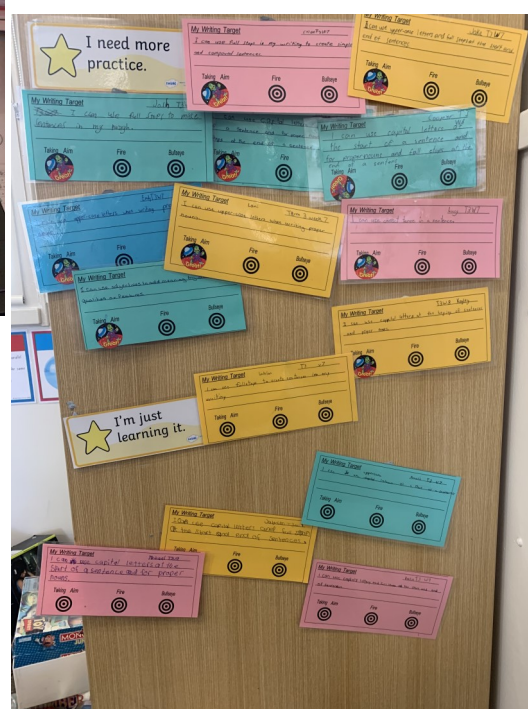
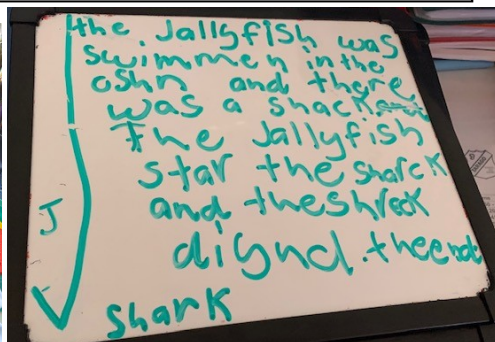
It is great to have our 3-6 buddies back from camp. We hope you had a great time.

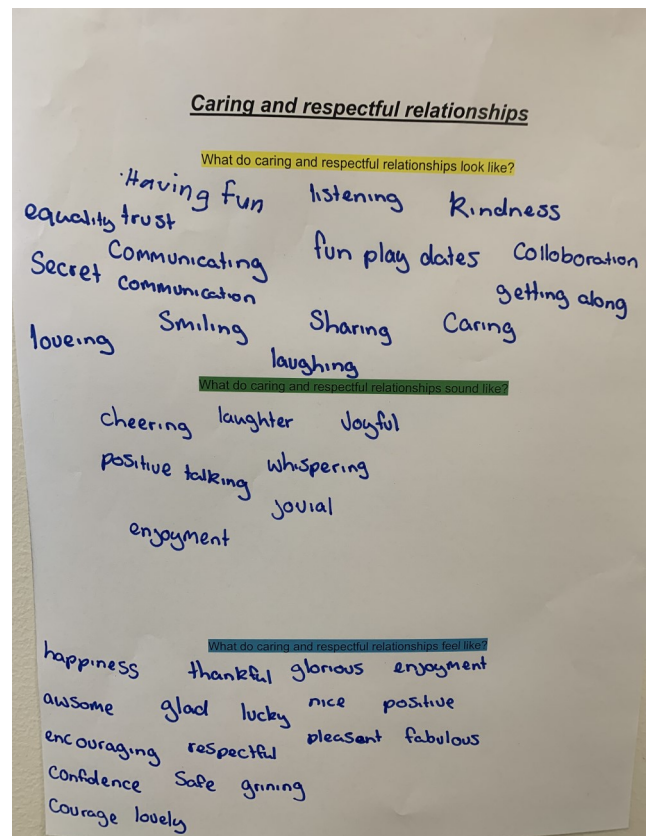
### **Student Details**
