


In K-2 the children have been learning about having a growth mindset and facing challenges in a positive way. The children talked about how the brain is like a muscle and it gets stronger when we exercise it by doing things that challenge us a little. We learned about the "learning pit". The Learning Pit represents a challenge. Taking on a challenge is like getting into a pit. We may feel uncertain and it takes effort to climb out. When we do climb out, it means we've learnt something new. The class talked about how persevering and asking for help can help us get out of the learning pit. When we learn new things that challenge us, it's not that we can't do it, we just have learned it YET!

This week in the Primary Class, students have been investigating different strategies that they can use for addition and subtraction problems. Strategies that have been investigated include the jump, compensation and split strategy.

Music: Count Us In

This week, students will begin a program in music called Music: Count Us In. This program culminates in the National Celebration Day on the 7th of November, when more than half a million students sing the same song, on the same day, at the same time – the annual Program Song. It is a song written by students, for students. The 2019 Program Song is called 'We Are' and will involve over 745,000 students from more than 3,400 schools all around Australia.

Student Awareness of Anaphylaxis

Having supportive friends and class mates is important for students at risk of anaphylaxis. Following these simple rules can assist in keeping everyone safe and reducing the risk of our friends and classmates with allergies.

Key messages include:

- ◆ always take allergies seriously – severe allergies are no joke
- ◆ don't share your food with friends who have food allergies
- ◆ wash your hands after eating or touching food
- ◆ know what your friends are allergic to
- ◆ if a friend/student becomes sick or unwell, get help from an adult immediately
- ◆ be respectful of a student's adrenaline auto injector
- ◆ don't pressure your friends to eat food that they are allergic to.
