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## Kindergarten 2020

Enrolment packs are currently available for students commencing Kindergarten in 2019. Children turning five by 31<sup>st</sup> July 2020 are eligible to enrol.

For all enquiries regarding the enrolment process or our school, please phone or drop into the school office. Our office is attended every day except Mondays.

Kindergarten Orientation begins Tuesday 29th October and will run, each Tuesday, until 26th November. Children need to arrive at school by 9.20am with a piece of cut up fruit or vegetable, for 'Crunch N Sip', a drink and their lunch. Orientation finishes at 12.10pm, the end of lunchtime. Children must wear clothing appropriate to the school environment, including enclosed shoes. Any children attending Pre-School on Tuesday can be escorted by our staff, with prior notice, to the Pre-School at the conclusion of lunchtime.

Tarago PS is also part of TREC (Tablelands Rural Education Community). We come together with other rural schools and participate in Sporting and Academic activities. This is an enriching and engaging community that adds to the education and wellbeing of our students.

We look forward to meeting the newest members of our school community.

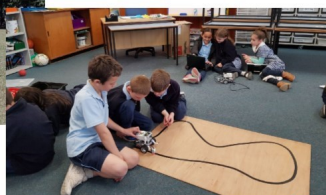


Our School comprises of 2 classes catering for grades K-2 and 3-6.

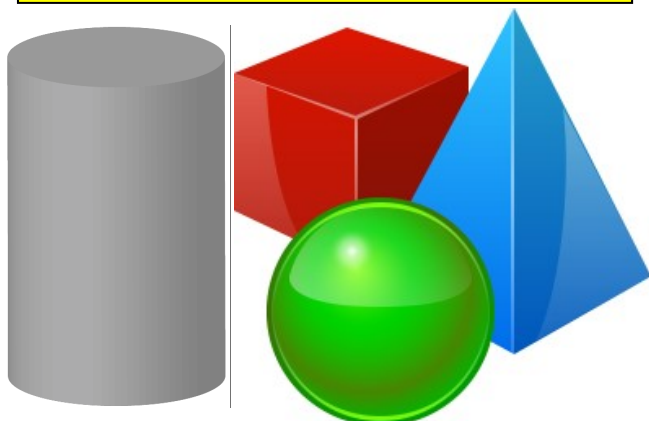
