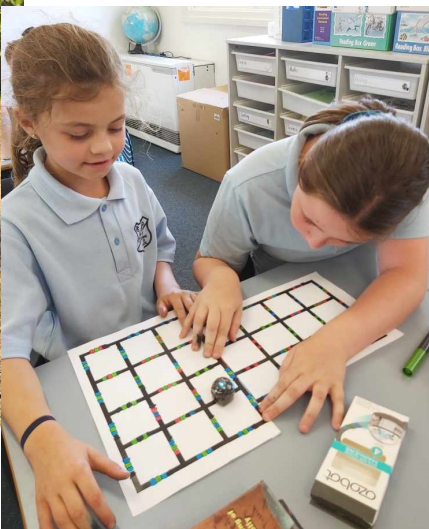
News from 3-6

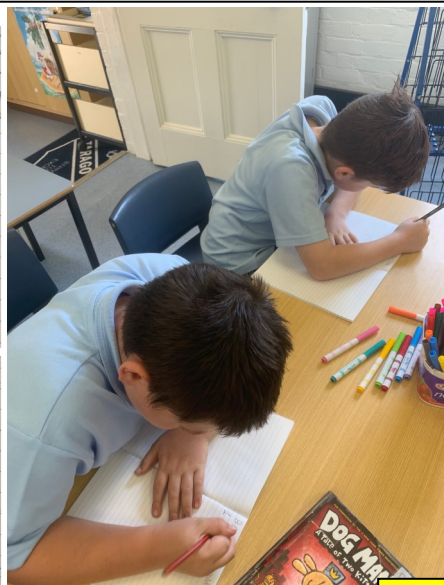
News from the Library

Healthy Eating / Lunch Boxes

It is important that children have healthy snacks and lunches for school. Here are some handy hints when it comes to packing lunch boxes.

- Cut fruit into pieces and put them in a small container. Squeeze some lemon juice on apples or pears to stop them from going brown.
- Cut up vegetables such as carrots, celery and cucumber and put them in a resealable plastic bag. Put dips or yoghurt in a separate container.
- Make wholemeal muffins and freeze them.
- Try different breads, such as rolls, pita, wholegrain or tortilla wraps.
- If using tomato in a sandwich, slice it thinly and place the slices between other fillings to stop the sandwich from going soggy.
- Cook a little extra dinner and save some for lunch the next day. You could make quiche, homemade pizza slices, salmon patties, roast vegetables, noodle salads or sausages. A freezer brick or frozen drink can help keep this food fresh.
- Pack food that is easy to open, easy to eat and not messy.
- Write your child's name on their lunch box, water bottle and any other containers.
- Include a frozen drink bottle to keep food cold. Wrap it in a tea towel in case it leaks.
- Use insulated lunch boxes or cooler bags. Pack a water bottle for your child each day and remind them that they can also get water from the taps or bubblers throughout the day.

SCHOOL ZONE

PARKING OFFENCES



NO STOPPING

Under no circumstances are you allowed to stop here. (Unless there is a medical or other emergency)

Maximum Penalty

\$344

+ 2 Demerit points



NO PARKING

You may stop here for no more than 2 minutes, when picking up or dropping off passengers and stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. Otherwise no stopping is permitted.

Maximum Penalty

\$191

+ 2 Demerit points



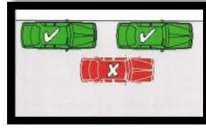
BUS ZONE

You are not allowed to stop your vehicle unless you are driving a bus

Maximum Penalty

\$344

+ 2 Demerit points



DOUBLE PARKING

You are not permitted to stop or park your vehicle alongside another vehicle that is already parked parallel to the kerb.

Maximum Penalty

\$344

+ 2 Demerit points

TRAFFIC OFFENCES



CHILDREN CROSSING

When flags are displayed, drivers must not proceed through the **crossing** if children or adults are still on the **crossing** or about to start **crossing**. This is the law regardless of the presence of a **crossing** supervisor. When children's **crossings** flags are not displayed, pedestrians should give way to passing road traffic.

Penalty

\$572

+ 4 Demerit points



SPEEDING OFFENCES

School Zone speeding offences attract higher fines & demerit points than other speeding offences.

Maximum Penalty

\$2,635

+ 7 Demerit points



MOBILE PHONE USE

Driving using a hand held phone in a school zone.

Penalty

\$457

+ 5 Demerit

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
