As we wrap up Term One, we are excited to share the wonderful progress our students have made in their learning journey. It has been a term filled with exploration, creativity, and a love for learning!

Spelling and Blending: This term, our focus has been on developing foundational spelling skills through blending sounds. The students have shown remarkable enthusiasm as they learn to combine individual sounds to form words. Their confidence in spelling is growing, and we encourage you to continue practicing these skills at home. In term two children will continue on with homework, practicing blending sounds and reading words.

Reading: Students have been introduced to a variety of texts, and we are thrilled to see their excitement for stories. Our use of iPads in the classroom has allowed students to access interactive reading programs like Reading Eggs, which has further enhanced their literacy skills. We encourage you to read with your child regularly to foster their love for books.

Writing: In writing, students have been experimenting with letters, words, and simple sentences. They are learning to express their ideas through drawings and written words. We are proud of their creativity and the progress they have made in articulating their thoughts on paper.

Mathematics: This term, our young mathematicians have been focusing on understanding numbers up to ten.

Through various hands-on activities and games, students have developed their counting skills and are beginning to recognise and write numbers confidently.

Technology in Learning: This term, we have integrated technology into our learning with the use of iPads for Reading Eggs and Mathseeds. 2-3 News - Mrs Taylor

As Term One comes to a close, we have been reflecting on a term filled with learning, creativity and building upon previous knowledge.

Spelling: This term, our focus has been on developing a range of spelling strategies that utilise sound, visual, and memory triggers to help our students correctly spell tricky words. They have been identifying each sound in words and matching it to the correct letters while learning a variety of rules to support these choices. Their confidence in spelling is growing, and their knowledge of advanced sounds and chunking strategies is aiding them as they encounter unfamiliar words in their reading.

Reading: In reading, students have been

focusing on recognising and becoming more familiar with the purpose and structural elements of different texts. Through modelled reading sessions, we have explored new vocabulary and the diverse sentence structures and grammar used by authors. Our daily fluency partner sessions have been instrumental developing skills such as phrasing, accurate decoding, interpreting punctuation, and using expression. The children have particularly enjoyed reading plays to enhance their expressive reading. Writing: In writing, students have been researching and composing texts about the incredible sea turtles found Australia and the wonders of the Southern Cross constellation. We have learned to plan and organise our ideas before writing, embellishing our sentences with noun groups and employing the Who, What,

When, Where, and How questioning strategy to add more detail. As a result, their confidence in writing is blossoming!


Mathematics: Our young mathematicians have been focusing on understanding larger numbers up to 1000 and developing a range of mental strategies to enhance
